



PSAD 2022 Science Award

The PsychoSocial Aspects of Diabetes (PSAD) Study Group aims to stimulate **early-career researchers and clinicians** to conduct high quality scientific research in the field of diabetes psychology. One way to boost the careers of these early-career researchers and make sure that talented researchers keep working in the area of diabetes is by granting the PSAD Science Award **to the first author of the best paper in the area of Psycho-Social aspects of Diabetes.**

Applications are welcome from **all PSAD members who are working towards a doctoral degree (PhD) or have a doctoral degree (PhD) not older than 5 years (pro-rata).** It is also possible to nominate a researcher from your own team (if they meet the qualifications) for the award.

Applications should include:

- a) Full name, address, date of PhD award and 2-page curriculum vitae of the applicant.
- b) One original article, published in a peer reviewed journal, in the past 3 years. The main research questions of this article should address psychosocial aspects of diabetes.
- c) If the applicant is not the first or sole author, a statement of his/her role in the research and writing of the paper is required, signed by the applicant and his/her co-authors.
- d) If the original article was not published in the English language an English translation must be provided.

The winner of the **PSAD Science Award** will be selected by a panel. This panel is nominated by the Executive Committee of the PSAD and consists of three acknowledged experts in psychosocial research in diabetes. Original articles are rated according to their clinical significance, scientific quality, innovativeness, and clarity of presentation. The winner will be formally announced during the annual PSAD Scientific Meeting on 1st Dec 2022. **The recipient will be invited to present his/her research at this meeting in person.**

This award prize is £500
