

2024 PSAD Annual Scientific Meeting: Early Career Researcher Travel Fellowships

The PsychoSocial Aspects of Diabetes (PSAD) Study Group aims to stimulate **all researchers and clinicians** from across the globe to conduct high quality scientific research in the field of psychosocial aspects of diabetes (<u>Snoek</u>, <u>2019</u>). In over 25 years since its inauguration, the PSAD's geographical focus has largely been Europe with a few members from the Americas and Australasia. As the PSAD study group moves into its second quarter-century, it has ambitions for increased global inclusivity.

The PSAD conference is inviting applications for **6 Travel Fellowships**, of which three are ringfenced for early career researchers from low- or middle-income countries (LMIC). Travel Fellowships will:

- Boost the careers of successful PSAD fellows
- Increase interest in PSAD membership and participation for prospective applicants
- Increase visibility of psychosocial needs of people living with diabetes in the fellow's local and national healthcare, education and research communities
- Encourage continued research focus in psychosocial aspects of diabetes.

Each Travel Fellowship includes:

- An award of €400 per fellowship for early career researcher members living and working in High Income
 Countries or €600 per fellowship for members living and working Low-Middle-Income-Countries
- Registration for the three-day conference being held in Würzburg, Germany
- One-year free membership to PSAD

Applications are invited from early career researcher PSAD members who meet the following criteria:

- 1. The applicant is working towards a doctoral degree (PhD) or has a PhD for no more than 5 years (accounting career disruption) for in a relevant subject area (see point 3)
- For applicants from low- or middle-income countries, demonstratable evidence of their research is being undertaken in a region defined as low or middle income by the WHO/ OECD list https://www.oecd.org/dac/financing-sustainable-development/development-finance-standards/daclist.htm
- 3. The research topic should be psychosocial aspects of diabetes; e.g. intervention studies of diabetes self-management support or psychological treatment; observational studies of psychosocial outcomes like depression, distress, disordered eating, stigma. The research can be quantitative or qualitative or mixed methods.

Application procedure:

- 1. Submit an abstract https://de.research.net/r/psad-2024-abstracts by the deadline 17th December 2023 midnight CET
- 2. Submit a 500-word letter of application and a two-page CV by 31st December 2023 midnight CET
- 3. All applications will be reviewed by a panel of experts in the field with the support of the PSAD
- 4. Successful candidates will be notified by 31st January 2024
- 5. Travel Fellowship recipients will be invited to present their research at the PSAD meeting
